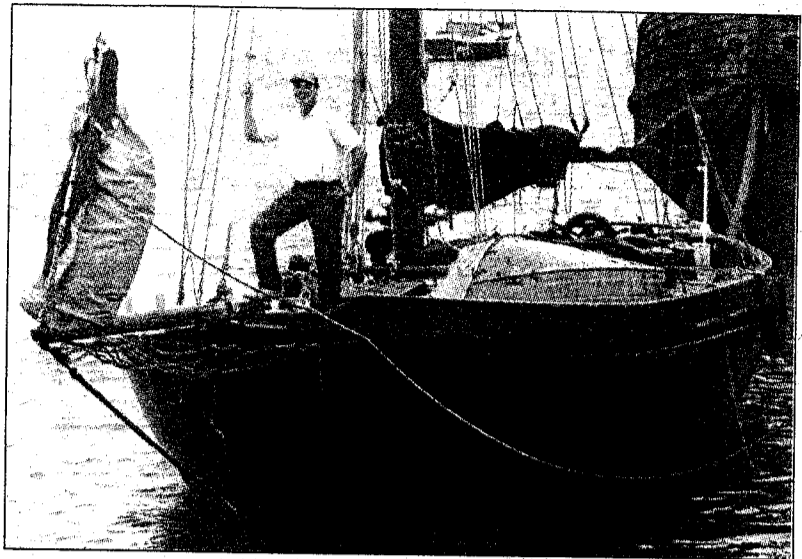
Love boat sails out of history

Karl Hutchison and his labour of love, the historic cutter Karin III, will take to Waitemata Harbour today as part of the annual Auckland Anniversary Regatta.

The Karin III originally belonged to the tea tycoon and keen sailor Thomas Lipton. Designed by a noted boat builder, Colin Archer, the cutter was built in Stockholm, Sweden, around 1898.

Mr Hutchison, a personnel consultant of Glenfield, heard that the cutter was anchored in the Bay of Islands four years ago. She had sunk and he was able to buy her from the former owner for salvage costs of \$15,000.

Restoration has been underway since and Mr Hutchison estimates a third of the teak used in her construction has been replaced. It has taken all his savings

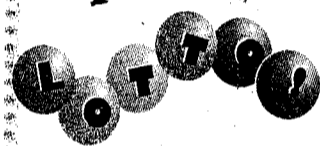
and spare time to get this far, with years of work still to go.

Principals predict to

School pupils are in for a tough year, according to principals, who are predicting a shortage of teachers, shared classes and a drop in education standards.

As pupils start school this week the Ministry of Education said it was confident a qualified teacher would be in front of every classroom — even if only temporarily.

The Auckland Primary Principals Association president, Brian Annan, said 10 teaching positions were still vacant on Friday and teachers in the ministry's flying squad of overseas staff would step in temporarily until the posts were filled.

While the ministry had resolved the teacher crisis in the short term, he said, schools would strike prob-

lems as the pool of spare teachers ran dry when permanent staff resigned or got sick.
